Sadly, after a murder attempt on my father during political struggles, life was never the same. My parents felt that Guatemala was no longer safe, so we sought asylum in the USA. I admire my parents' strength to leave their native country and seek a better life for us. From a young age, they taught me the importance of giving back and the beauty of diversity. When we first arrived in America, we received help from many organizations, so now we try to help others in need as we were helped during our struggles.

Growing up I had a lisp, which made me self-conscious. As a child I went to speech therapy, but never fully grasped how I was viewed differently until 4th grade when classmates made fun of my pronunciation. This self-awareness caused me to close off. Throughout elementary and middle school, I never voluntarily voiced my opinion. When I joined the achieve Family, I committed myself to go out of my comfort zone. Freshman year, I ran for Class Council to be the voice for others who, like me, were afraid to speak up. I tried to not let my lisp hold me back. I slowly started seeing a change in my confidence and was less nervous about public speaking.

My years in **achieve** have been beneficial in many ways. At the start of my journey, I was nervous about the Family Meeting presentations, specifically my first one. But as I gave my speech, my nervousness diminished, realizing that everyone in the room was supporting me. This experience built my confidence, allowing me to speak with ease in public. **achieve** also provided summer internships during which I discovered my passion for Computer Science. Interning at UC Berkeley's Unboxing Data Science Program, I was able to broaden my

Python coding skills and learn how relevant data science is to many careers. This program taught me how to connect science to prevalent problems in our society, fueling my passion for Computer Science and encouraging me to pursue it as my major.

Along with the endless support I have received from **achieve**, I also gained priceless memories. My favorite

Even though my mom was released when I was one, she had to fight long and hard to get me back, to prove that she was fit to be my mom. This is why I have so much grit and determination. My mom has shown me that no matter what your situation, you need to always keep going to achieve your goal.

**achieve** gave me the opportunity to attend Riordan without the financial burden on my mom. With encouragement from **achieve**, I discovered my leadership potential. I joined Student Government and was elected Co-Student Body President this year and am the president of the Black Student Union. I also had the opportunity to participate in varsity sports. **achieve** has supported all of my endeavors.

**achieve** has helped me in many ways throughout high school. Through the many presentations at the Family Meetings, I have become confident when speaking to large groups. I have learned professional skills such as interviewing, completing job applications, and learning how to dress to impress. I have also become a better student. When I first started Riordan, I struggled

to keep up. Thankfully, my **achieve** mentor helped me get back on track. I attended weekly meetings where I was taught how to properly plan out my schedule. **achieve** has also helped me understand the importance of asking questions. I used to be afraid that if I asked the "wrong" question I would be ridiculed. **achieve** has taught me the value of being unafraid to succeed.

#### PRICELESS GIFTS

My parents and grandparents immigrated from the Philippines and have had to work hard all their lives. Growing up in Daly City, I had to deal with many family issues. My parents separated when I was an infant, so I lived with my dad, uncle, and grandparents. My mother has never been a part of my life and my father has faced challenges with addiction. We live with extended family

in a really small home where privacy is difficult, and there is often conflict. Currently my father is incarcerated and will not be released until after I graduate from college. Through meditation, reflection, and my Catholic faith, I have been able to push through my family problems and grow stronger.

Aside from the scholarship, **achieve** has helped me in many ways. **achieve** taught me how to get out of my comfort zone through volunteering, internships, and a lifetime's worth of public speaking. **achieve** has also helped me with my procrastination and academic issues by requiring the use of a planner to keep track of important events, deadlines and dates. Also, by getting into my dream high school, as well as being accepted into college, my **achieve** Family has given me so much hope, stomping out my doubts about the future.

**achieve** has provided me with so many momentous experiences. Professionally, I had the opportunity to experience remote and

in-person internships. I attended an **achieve** job bootcamp in which I learned about work etiquette, including important skills such as organization, communication, cooperation and professionalism in the workplace. **achieve** gave me knowledge, but also joyous experiences with my peers. One great example of this is the Boston College Tour with **achieve** juniors and seniors. Bonding with my **achieve** siblings and traveling to a totally different environment was fun, educational, and most importantly, memorable.

Working as a summer intern at Kaiser Permanente had the biggest impact on me. I was placed in the pharmacy, where I worked in Ambulatory Care and Out-Patient Services. I assisted with office tasks, and I was able to get hands-on experience with patients and clients. The Kaiser Launch Program helped me appreciate the importance of hard work, responsibility, self-care, and bonding with coworkers. This experience confirmed that my future was in medicine.

As I look towards my college journey, I am now mentally and emotionally preparing to leave my humble home in Daly City and attend a college many miles away. The **achieve** Program has helped me to gain the confidence and skills I need to move on to this next step in my journey. Through all of our Family Meeting presentations, trips, cultural events and internships, **achieve** has taught me about work life in the adult world, doing good for others, and making every moment count. I have honed my ability to work with others, socialize, and leap out of my comfort zone. **achieve** has given me priceless gifts of knowledge and experience—academically, professionally and socially—and I know I am more than ready to venture into the unknown and make the world a better place.

### PERSONAL GROWTH

Growing up as a daughter of Mexican immigrants, our budget was always tight. However, we were always there for one another: cooking, taking care of each other, and our dad building us toys from found objects. As the eldest child, I was the family translator, even going to my abuelita's doctor's appointments and talking with her doctors. But I never saw any of this as a burden. In fact, it led me to love helping those around me, no matter what the task.

As I matured, it became more difficult to juggle my personal life with my school life. This school year, three of my grandparents suddenly became ill and my mom was the only available sibling to care for them. I took on my mom's household responsibilities: cooking, cleaning, and caring for my two younger sisters. I was not mentally prepared for this sudden transition because it was a bigger workload than I expected. In November of 2022, my family and I took an emergency trip to Mexico because my dad's mom was gravely ill. During that time in Mexico, I did not have adequate internet access, causing me to fall behind in school. Coming back, I felt like giving up because I had double the workload and a busy schedule. Even though it got hard at times, achieve was always there to support me and give me the help I needed.

As a first-generation student, I never imagined myself going to college because no one in my family had even finished high school. At my **achieve** interview, I remember being asked if I would go to college out-of-state and I said, "Yes!" with a big smile on my face. As the years passed and the summer before senior year was here, we began the college process: researching colleges, creating a fit sheet, and writing our personal statements. I made my college list and I started working on my applications. As I submitted my applications one-by-one, my heart was filled with joy. When I received my first acceptance to college, my family celebrated with me. This was the moment when I realized that I will actually be going to college and make my entire family proud.

Even though **achieve** is considered a scholarship program, it is so much more than that. It has helped me grow as a person, as a young woman who will make a difference in the world. I have learned so many essential life skills, like speaking in front of large groups, staying organized by using my planner, enforcing strict deadlines for assignments, proper work etiquette, and the value of giving back to my community. The cultural events,

Christmas parties, and internships taught me to dress according to the event and built my confidence to converse with adults and to connect easily with those who do not share my life experience.

My most memorable **achieve** moments have happened during the **achieve** Christmas parties and during the Boston college tour. They are the events where I was able to bond with my peers. At the Christmas party we are strongly encouraged to talk to one another because we are sitting together and must cooperate during the dreaded Trivia Contest. During our college tour, we connected more and learned about one another during our long bus rides and communal dinners at fun restaurants in Boston. The college tour also gave me the opportunity to not only visit different campuses, but to think about what kind of college environment would be best for me.

As I move on to the next chapter in life, I will continue to help others as my family and **achieve** have taught me. I intend to go outside my comfort zone, connecting with others, especially those who may not share my culture or socio-economic background. Wherever I go, I want to build a tight knit community by working with local organizations that help those in need. **achieve** has taught me that family is not necessarily defined by blood relations, and has helped to make me into a strong young woman who will make her mark wherever she goes.

My first connection to the **achieve** Program was through my older sister who was part of the Holy Names High School **achieve** Program and is currently in her third year of college. Having my older sister be a part of the **achieve** Program helped me understand what **achieve** offers students. Seeing her go through college applications, prep for SAT/ACT, and the scholarship process, gave me an insightful lesson on what was in store for me in high school. Learning how **achieve** was caring in leading her through those times gave me the impression that **achieve** could be the place for me to grow and mature into an adult. Through **achieve**, she also gained a profound group of people she can call lifetime friends. That is the community **achieve** offered and is exactly what I wanted to experience.

An example of this type of moment is when I went to my very first cultural event, *Cabaret*. This was in 2019, and my first time ever attending a professional production. This musical taught me something very important early on in my high school career: that every person has a part to play in the betterment of our world. This can be through environmental policy, peacemaking, or just making a positive impact on the people you meet. It has been a strong ideal that I use today to push my various passions. Another highlight of achieve was my summer internship at UCSF Global Health, which expanded my interest in global health while building bonds with experts in the field from all over the world.
